Finding an adoption competent therapist who understands the unique needs of members of the adoption triad is important for successful treatment. Therapists need to understand areas such as disrupted attachment, grief and loss, trauma, navigating birth parent relationships, transitions from foster care to adoption, race issues in trans-racial families, identity development, and trauma-informed parenting.
